Institute for Religious Liberty Events.

Thomas More University's Wm. T. (Bill) Robinson III Institute for Religious Liberty is sponsoring two upcoming events. **On February 10, 2020 at 7 p.m., Paul Kengor, Ph.D. will present "How the Catholic Church Confronted Communism and Socialism."** Kengor is the acclaimed author of the New York Times best-seller "A Pope and a President." He will discuss how the Catholic Church responded to the Soviet Union's militant "war on religion."

On February 13, 2020 at 7 p.m., the IRL will host "Civil Dialogue: An Antidote to Polarization." Rev. Kristen Farrington will speak about her experience promoting civil dialogue while directing the Religious Freedom Center of the Freedom Forum Institute in Washington, D.C.
